



A reminder that if you take Required Minimum Distributions from your IRA and give to Bethel Hill, then its likely you could have significant savings on your taxes next year. To get the savings next year you need to set up your RMD to go directly to Bethel Hill, then it is likely the RMD will not count towards your taxable income. You should talk with your financial advisor about your specific tax implications and with your financial institution to set up your RMD going directly to a qualified charity (Bethel Hill).

Aren't you worth a few hours of down time just for yourself? to attend church? to pray? to attend a breakfast once a month for one hour? to do some handwork for someone else? to take a few hours on a Saturday to join with other women sharing in a Saturday of learning, eating and 'playing'? Playing is what we think we are doing when what we are doing is just for ourselves. I don't know about you, but I find each of these renewing.

Join us for just an hour on the second Saturday of each month for Women's Breakfast where we share a light breakfast, chat with friends and have a devotional.

Women's Ministry is still working of dresses through September to help prevent girls from being abducted for trafficking. Dresses can be taken to church and hung up for display or delivered to the Old Sunday School Room. Kits with pattern, fabric and bias tape are available.

For the sewers, the Methodist Hospital is asking for Heart Pillows for the heart and lung transplant patients as well as walker bags for those who need them.
