



Our tale begins in the summer of 2024. Jeff Varner (our 10:30 organist) noticed an issue with the organ stops. Grafton (our organ company) came out to service the instrument. It was discovered that mice had destroyed the felt on the majority of our 40 organ stops. The felt allows the stops to silently open and close. A rough estimate of at least \$4,000.00 was given to replace the felts. Grafton could do the work, but no longer carry that brand and might have difficulty finding replacement parts. Should further damage come to light, the repairs would cost significantly more. At that time (and still today), the organ still works, though some stops are no longer usable because of the missing felt.

A big thank you to Jeff who did a lot of research and attended several Church Council meetings to give us updates. Jeff also consulted Cunningham Piano Company. Neither company wants to repair the organ because of its age (almost 40 years), its outdated technology, and the difficulty in finding parts.

Because Grafton no longer deals in Allen organs, and because of unfamiliarity and less life expectancy with their new brand, Jeff got a few bids from Cunningham. One bid included a gently used 3 manual Allen organ (it has been at our Annual Conference) for \$50,000, which is considerably less than a comparable instrument brand new. It would still be guaranteed and has a life expectancy of around 38 years. Installation would involve new speakers (with the

holes being opened by Bethel Hill volunteers or by a contractor we hire) and would probably take a week or so. This new organ is so constructed as to be mouse-proof!

Late in 2024, the Church Council approved a deposit on this instrument. This holds the organ for Bethel Hill for one year. The Finance Team will be recommending to Church Council to move forward with the purchase of this organ. Both Hannah (our 9:00 organist) and Jeff have given this organ a trial run and approve. Training is included in the cost, so they get familiar with all the new bells and whistles.

You know how vital the organ is to our worship services. You hear it playing as you enter and leave the sanctuary. It provides accompaniment to our hymn singing. It provides a meditative background during offering and Holy Communion. It announces a bride and groom as they are married. It plays Alleluia as babies are baptized. The organ is a blessed part of our corporate worship, and we bless God with the sounds it makes. How can you help? You can make a donation to this "organ project" in many You can write a check to Bethel wavs. Hill UMC with organ in the memo line. You can add a gift through your electronic giving. You can write an amount in on your offering envelope. And so, our tale ends with you! If you enjoy hearing the organ when you come to church, make a donation! And thank God for the sound of music in the sanctuary!


